ART. 1 – ORGANIZATION

Atletica Zoldo ASD - located at Via Roma 26 - Val di Zoldo - BL, Italy, in collaboration with ValdiZoldo Funivie SpA, Ristoro da Bepi, Ski Civetta, and the Municipality of Val di Zoldo, CAI Val di Zoldo, and CSI (Italian Sports Center), organizes the first edition of the "CIVETTA A TOLECH" (CAT), a nighttime snow race to be held on Saturday, March 14, 2026.

The CAT is an eco-friendly event: only existing facilities will be used and adapted, with no impact on the environment.

ART. 2 - GENERAL INFORMATION

The CAT is a running race in a natural mountain environment. This requires athletes to be self-reliant between the start and finish, both in terms of nutrition, equipment, and safety. They must also be aware of the possibility of arising adversities during the event, such as adverse weather conditions, injuries, etc.

The race will take place at night on a partially or fully snow-covered terrain along trails and some groomed/ungroomed ski slopes sections in the Val di Zoldo Skiarea.

The route, approximately 4 km long with a 350 m elevation gain, must be completed within 2 hours.

The start is scheduled in Piazza Balestra, Pecol – Val di Zoldo, near the Camping Civetta, at 6:30 PM, with the finish line located at Pian del Crép (1,765 m). The route will be marked with appropriate signs all along the way.

Athletes can sign up choosing two separate race formats:

- **competitive race**
 - it requires to provide a medical certificate for sports issued by a licenced physician
 - racers will be time-recorded and ranked in a chronometric-ordered list
 - the fastest 5 men and women will be awarded

- **non-competitive race**
 - no medical certificate required
 - non-competitive racers will be time-recorded and be listed in an alphabetically-ordered separate list showing the finish time
 - non- competitive racers will not be involved in the award ceremony

Besides the aforementioned differences, both formats are subjected to the same regulations (including the route, distance, elevation gain, registration fee etc.) and all racers will run together from start to finish. All racers will receive bibs, a race-pack, refreshment drinks and food after the finish line, an after-race pasta party free allowance (SEE ART.4 BELOW)

The descent back to the start will take place exclusively by cable car; the cost of the ticket is included in the registration fee. Under no circumstances will it be allowed to get back to the start on foot along the ski slopes; such behavior will result in the disqualification from the race and sanctions will be issued according to the law.

ART. 3 - PARTICIPATION

The race is open to all persons, men and women, born in 2010 or earlier. For reasons of order and safety, running with dogs is not permitted.

Participation requires mountain experience, excellent physical and mental training, and a genuine ability to manage the challenges inherent in this type of event. It is prohibited to be accompanied along the route by anyone who is not a registered racer.

It is mandatory to wear clothing suitable to the temperature conditions, which can vary from +10°C to - 20°C, and to have the equipment specified in Article 5 of these Regulations.

Athletes in possession of a valid SPORTS MEDICAL CERTIFICATE FOR COMPETITIVE ACTIVITY, recognized by their country of residence, regardless of their membership in a sports club or federation, and valid at least until the end of the race, may register for the competitive race. Such medical certificate must be issued within a year from the day of the race.

Registration for the non-competitive race implies a tacit self-certification of physical fitness to engage in non-competitive sport activity and exempts the organizers from requiring a medical certificate.

ART. 4 - REGISTRATION

Registration opens on January 10th and will close when the maximum number of 150 athletes is reached. Registration is possible until March 12th with a €25 fee at the Pecol Tourist Office, or [ONLINE HERE](#) Registrations can also be completed on race day by picking up bibs BEFORE 6:00 PM. In this case, the fee will be €30.

Registrations for minors must be completed by a parent.

Atletica Zoldo ASD is a non-profit volunteers sports association; registration fees are intended as individual

contributions from competitors to cover organizational costs and not as purchases of services.

The fee also includes: - bib; - gadget for all participants; - refreshments at the finish line; - the pasta party at the " Ristoro Da Bepi" Hut after the race; - transportation of change bags to the finish line; - return by cable car.

The liability waiver and privacy policy, which can be downloaded from the Atletica Zoldo website on the race page, must be read and accepted upon registration.

The medical certificate for competitive sports, required to participate in the competitive race, if not provided online, must be submitted in paper format at the bib distribution point. Failure to provide this certificate will result in the athlete only being able to take part in the non-competitive race.

Any potential additional documentation required and the procedures for submitting it will be published on the website and communicated to all registered participants, but will still be considered mandatory.

A competitor who fails to provide the necessary documents will not be able to participate in the race and will not be entitled to a refund of the registration fee.

ART. 5 - MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

By registering for the race, each athlete undertakes to carry all the mandatory equipment listed below, in perfect condition and in working order, for the entire duration of the race, under penalty of disqualification:

- suitable footwear for running on snow;
- headlamp with a charged battery;
- Long-sleeved waterproof jacket suitable for inclement weather at altitude (worn or in a backpack);
- Long-sleeved shirt (worn or in a backpack);
- Pants that cover the knee (worn or in a backpack);
- Gloves (worn or in a backpack);

It is also recommended to start with the following equipment:

- Removable crampons;
- Poles;
- Hat or bandana;
- Mobile phone with a fully charged battery and with the organization's numbers saved in the address book.

ART. 6 - BIB

The Bib number distribution will take place on the day of the event, from 4:30 PM to 6:00 PM in the area near the start (Camping Civetta, Piazza Balestra, Pecol – Val di Zoldo)

Bib number collection must be carried out by the registered athlete, with no possibility of delegation.

When collecting the bib: - Athletes who have not yet registered will sign the liability waiver and the declaration regarding the processing of personal data;

- Medical certificates must be submitted if not previously provided;
- Mandatory equipment will be checked;
- Athletes' change bags will be collected upon arrival;
- A gift will be given to all registered athletes.

The bib number must be fully visible throughout the race and must be worn on the chest or stomach, therefore it must be placed over any clothing.

ART. 7 - ATHLETE'S BAGS

A transport service will be provided and the bags with a change of clothes for after the race will be delivered by the finish line to be collected by athletes.

Athletes must drop off their bags at the bib collection point by 6:00 PM. It is recommended to keep both the volume and weight as low as possible, and not to place fragile or valuable items in them. The Association takes no responsibility for any theft, loss, and/or damage to bags or their contents.

ART. 8 - RANKINGS AND PRIZES

Only those registered for the competitive race will be included in the rankings, and an overall ranking and a general ranking for men and women will be issued. Prizes will be awarded to the top five finishers in each of the men's and women's categories.

ART. 9 - CHANGES TO/ON THE ROUTE, CANCELLATION

The management reserves the right to modify the route at any time in the event of adverse weather conditions and may decide to postpone or cancel the start and/or modify and/or shorten the route and/or interrupt or suspend the race at any time and at any point along the route. Suspension, postponement, or cancellation of the race will not entitle participants to get any refund of the registration fee.

ART. 10 - INSURANCE

The organization takes out liability insurance for the entire duration of the race.

Participation in the race is, in any case, the full and exclusive responsibility of the participants, who waive any recourse and/or action against the organizers and the organization in the event of death and/or damage to themselves, others, or property, as well as in the event of further consequences arising from the race. Upon registration, the runner accepts the liability release which can be found on the event website.

ART. 11 - IMAGE RIGHTS, DISCLAIMER

Each competitor expressly and freely waives the right to use their image rights during their participation in the race, as well as any recourse and/or action, in any venue, against the organization, its members, and its authorized partners, for the use of their image without territorial or time limits (see privacy policy).

The participant exonerates the organizers and the organization from any liability, both civil and criminal, for damages to persons and/or property caused by or resulting from them, in accordance with the provisions of the liability release.

ART. 12 - ACCEPTANCE OF THE REGULATIONS

The event will be conducted in accordance with these regulations and any changes and/or directives adopted by the Race Director, even at the last minute. Voluntary registration indicates full acceptance of these regulations and any changes made to them relating to any aspect of the competition.
